

POETRY LIKE BREAD: MIAMI'S FAVORITE POEMS PROJECT

OFF THE SHELF STAGE SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 19 FROM 3:30-4:30 P.M.

Selected by President Barack Obama in 2013 as only the fifth presidential inaugural poet in United States history, RICHARD BLANCO was the first Latinx, immigrant, and LGBTQ+ individual to serve in the role. And he made history again in 2022, when he was appointed MIAMI-DADE COUNTY'S FIRST-EVER POET LAUREATE by MAYOR DANIELLA LEVINE CAVA.

In this new role and led by his passion to connect community through poetry, Blanco has created the Poetry Like Bread: Miami's Favorite Poems Project, through which people from all walks of life are invited to share a favorite poem. Inspired by a line in a poem by Roque Dalton — ... poetry, like bread, is for everyone — Blanco believes that almost everyone has experienced a meaningful poem that has had some impact on their life and thinking. Hosted by Blanco and NICOLE TALLMAN, poetry ambassador for Miami-Dade County, the Poetry Like Bread project is launching this week at Miami Book Fair 2022 with special guest readers **LEVINE CAVA**, MDC President MADELINE PUMARIEGA and former U.S. Poet Laureate ROBERT PINSKY, among others, including poet and novelist **SANDRA CISNEROS** and poet MARCI CANCIO-BELLO. All will read their favorite poems.

VISUAL ARTS: ESTUARY, AN INSTALLATION

Estuary [Pavilion for MOAD], a work by Cuban American artist **RAFAEL DOMENECH** — who received a BFA from the New World School of the Arts at Miami Dade College in 2015 — functions on multiple levels. It is a public sculpture, a reflection on the written word, a platform for live performances and public gatherings, and a meditative


environment. Commissioned by the Museum of Art and Design at Miami Dade College, Estuary will be inaugurated at this year's Fair. Made from everyday construction materials, the work can mutate into a variety of distinct spatial



configurations. Large panels or "pages" of construction mesh feature laser-cut texts that will change throughout the duration of the project, which will be installed at Kyriakides Plaza and remain on view until January 2023 before traveling to other MDC campuses. MOAD will create programming for Estuary at each site of its installation. The project is curated by ISABELA VILLANUEVA.


STREET FAIR

Children's Alley is located on the upper plaza of Building 1; you'll find the Off The Shelf music stage at Kyriakides Plaza and NE First Avenue.







GETTING TO THE FAIR

DRIVING

FROM THE NORTH Take I-95 South and exit onto NW Eighth Street. Go straight to Fifth Street, then travel seven blocks to NE Second Ave.

FROM THE SOUTH Take U.S. 1 to I-95 North and exit onto NW Second Avenue. Go north two blocks to NW Fifth Street and turn right, then travel east six blocks to NE Second Avenue and turn right.

FROM THE EAST Take MacArthur Causeway West and exit onto Biscayne Boulevard. Go south eight blocks and turn right on NE Third Street.

FROM THE WEST Take SR 836 East and exit onto I-395. Exit right onto NE Second Avenue, then travel south eight blocks.

PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION

Rather not drive? No problem! Getting to MBF via public transportation is a breeze.

METRORAIL Park at any Metrorail Station for \$4.50 a day and ride the Metrorail to Government Center, where you can transfer to the Metromover (it's free!). Exit at either the College Bayside or College North Metromover station and walk right out into the excitement and energy of the Fair. Download the Miami-Dade Transit Tracker app for alternate transit routes.

BRIGHTLINE Hop on at the West Palm Beach or Fort Lauderdale station and take the train to the MiamiCentral Brightline station. Transfer to Metromover's Inner Loop and exit at the College North or College Bayside station.

TRI-RAIL From Broward County and all points north, ride Tri-Rail south to the Tri-Rail/Metrorail transfer station. Board the southbound Metrorail (see Metrorail).

TROLLEY Hop on and hop off the free Miami Trolley, which runs regular service to downtown on its Brickell, Coral Way, Midtown, and Overtown routes.


